

MARKET REPORT
BAKEWELL MARKET
Tuesday 19th April 2022



A modest number of stock for the Easter Tuesday Market with 177 Cattle and 536 Sheep on offer.

Buyers present or represented ensured a decent trade as the following statistics will demonstrate.

There were 88 Store & Breeding Cattle which sold exceedingly well with Steers to £1,320, Heifers £1,100 and Cow & Calf outfits £1,500.

In the Finished Cattle section prices topped at 296p and £2,036 per head with 10 Steers averaging 260.6p.

A short entry of 25 OTM Cattle were even dearer than last week with top figures 196p and £1,640, the average was creditable 153.4p for a very mixed sample.

Just 18 Calves with Bulls to £98 and Heifers £280.

Brisk business in the Sheep department.

The 20 Spring lambs peaked at 374p and £146.61 to average 352.3p.

Hogg numbers drying up fast with 379 forward. Top figures 323p and £158.36. The SQQ average at 287.4p.

The Cull Sheep entry amounted to 137 head with ewes to £198 to average a remarkable £125.13.
