Decent numbers and a solid trade with 784 cattle and 1,705 sheep on offer. Plenty to worry about with increased interest rates to add to the other concerns about costs, but the market continues to serve both vendors and purchasers keeping the wheels of commerce turning.

The store and breeding cattle were surprisingly busy with 441 head on offer. A good spread of customers ensured that trade remained strong at all price levels. Steers sold to £1550, heifers £1330 and feeding bulls £900. Cows & Calves to £1580.

A few less finished cattle this week and a great trade for the 117 on offer. Top figures 314p and £2,057 per head. The 50 heifers averaged a remarkable 262p and £1,539 per head.
