

# Market Report

## Bakewell Market

## MONDAY 19TH DECEMBER

Quite a busy market with the exception of the store cattle department, which seems to have finished early for Christmas. The extraordinary change in the weather with a saving of almost 20 degrees in less than 24 hours came as a relief to many who had experienced water supply problems. There was a particularly good entry of sheep and anyone who bought stock to market were rewarded with a decent price.

There were only 92 store & breeding cattle, including some very nice suckled calves which attracted fierce competition and some outstanding prices.

Within the small selection steers sold to £1,100, heifers £1,380 and bulls £920.

Things were rather busier in the finished cattle section, there were 91 head on offer and clearly wanted.

Top prices 309p and £2,054. You can tell trade was distinctively hot from the average for the 50 heifers at 269.7p.

85 OTM and feeding cows remaining very dear indeed.

Top prices 240p and £2,107 with a very respectable average of 164.5p.

Calf numbers at 35 with bulls to £330 and heifers £185.

Over in the sheep department numbers were pretty much normal with 1,438 lambs and 384 cull sheep.

Trade for the lambs was highly satisfactory with top figures 295p and £149.06 with the SQQ average at 256.3p.

In the cull section ewes sold to £220 to average a remarkable £106.86.
