



# Market Report

Bakewell Market

MONDAY 17TH JULY

Two weather related thoughts to start the report, firstly the equivalent market last year was the day when the temperatures reached 37 degrees and cattle vendors were asked to bring their stock the following week.

On another note, last Saturday was St Swithens day and it rained, if folklore is to be believed we might see rain for the next 40 days and 40 nights.

All cheerful stuff which did not deter farmers from bringing decent entries of stock to Bakewell where 622 cattle and 1,021 sheep were on sale.

Store & Breeding cattle numbers have picked up somewhat and there were 331 head on offer. Trade was excellent with steers to £1,690 and heifers £1,590, feeding bulls topped at £1,470.

In the breeding section cows and calves reached £1,920 and stock bulls £3,000.

In the finished cattle section numbers were good, however, prices were back a bit, but the best still sold to 334p and £2,072 per head.

The average for the 62 heifers was 257.1p a shade less than last week.

OTM numbers were down at 90 in total and prices also back a little. Top figures 231p and £2,240 per head the average emerged at 166.1 pence.

48 calves this week and very much in demand with both bulls and heifers topping at £370.

Over in the sheep section numbers were steady with 717 lambs forward. The best on offer to 328p and £157.86.

The SQQ average at 284.2 pence little changed from last week's 283.3 pence.

322 cull sheep on offer with ewes to £160 to average £112.55.

## **BOVINE TB – EXTENSION OF POST-MOVEMENT TB TESTING TO ANNUAL SURVEILLANCE TESTING PARTS OF THE EDGE AREA OF ENGLAND**

Following a public consultation in January 2021, Defra committed to introducing post-movement TB testing in annual surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area.

On 1 August 2023, post-movement TB testing will become compulsory for cattle (which includes farmed bison and Asiatic water buffalo) moved to annual surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area from higher TB incidence areas of England, and from Wales.

We are writing to inform you of how these changes may affect you.

### **What are the changes and how might they affect me?**

Cattle moved to herds in annual surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area from higher TB incidence areas of England and from Wales, will require compulsory post-movement skin testing between 60 and 120 days after their arrival on the destination holding. There are some specific exemptions listed in the Annex enclosed.

Higher TB incidence areas are:

- Six-monthly surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area of England
- High Risk Area (HRA) of England
- Wales

The new policy applies to direct movements of cattle from one holding to another, and to indirect movements of cattle via markets and shows. Cattle moving from annually tested herds in the HRA or six-monthly surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area (i.e. those eligible for earned recognition) are also required to be post-movement tested.

You will need to arrange post-movement testing with an approved veterinary surgeon or an approved tuberculin tester, and you will need to pay for the test. A government-funded whole herd TB surveillance test can be used as a post-movement test if the timing works.

Cattle that require a post-movement test cannot move to other holdings until the post-movement test has been completed with negative results. There are some specific exemptions listed in the Annex enclosed.



APHA will write to you each month for a time-limited period to notify you of any cattle movements that may require a post-movement test. However, ultimately it is your responsibility to arrange post-

movement testing with your veterinary practice and complete the test within the required timeframe.

### **Why is this policy change being introduced?**

The Animal & Plant Health Agency (APHA) estimated that inward movements of cattle with undetected TB infection was the source of 17% of new TB breakdowns in the Edge Area in 2021, although this proportion varied from county to county.

Post-movement TB testing will reduce the risk of disease spread through cattle movements and is an important measure to protect the lower TB incidence parts of the Edge Area. It will detect brought-in cases of TB earlier to minimise the scale and impact of the TB breakdown in the herd of destination and reduce the risk of further spread to other herds.

### **ANNEX**

#### **What cattle or type of movements are exempt from post-movement testing?**

- cattle slaughtered within 120 days of arrival in the herd
- cattle moved solely for veterinary treatment provided they are returned directly to the herd of origin after treatment or are killed or go directly to slaughter
- cattle moved to an **exempt** agricultural show in annual surveillance testing parts of the Edge Area, or cattle that return to those areas from an **exempt** agricultural show elsewhere. Cattle must return directly to their holding of origin, be killed, or go directly to slaughter after the show. An exempt agricultural show is one where cattle do not stay on the showground site for more than 24 hours and they are not housed
- cattle moved directly to one of the following:
  - a market from which all animals go direct to slaughter
  - an exempt market
  - an approved collecting centre
  - an approved finishing unit
  - an exempt finishing unit
- cattle moved under the authority of a movement licence issued by APHA

#### **What type of movements for cattle that require post-movement testing are allowed before the test has been completed with negative results?**

- movements direct to slaughter
- movements to slaughter via a TB slaughter gathering
- movements direct to a licensed finishing unit, an approved finishing unit or an exempt finishing unit
- movements to an approved finishing unit or an exempt finishing unit via an exempt market
- other movements made under the authority of a movement licence issued by APHA
